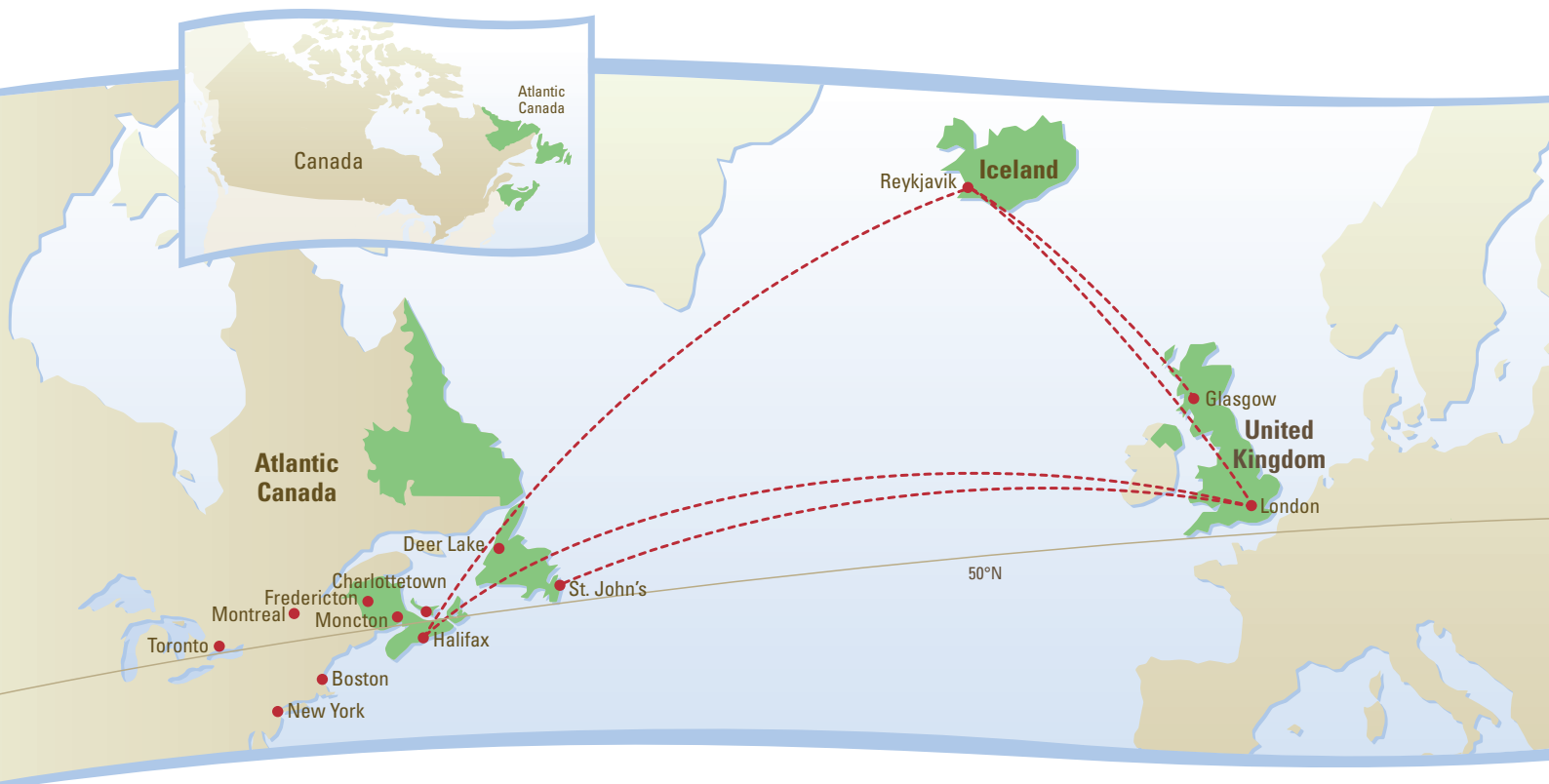


# You haven't experienced Canada until you visit Atlantic Canada

**UK to Halifax, Nova Scotia:**

- Air Canada: Winter service – 4 days/week, non-stop from London, Heathrow. Spring/Summer service – 7 days/week.
- Canadian Affair (Thomas Cook): Weekly seasonal service, non-stop from London Gatwick (May-Oct.).

- Icelandair: 2-3 flights/week seasonal service from London, Heathrow or Glasgow via Reykjavik (June-Oct.).

**UK to St. John's, Newfoundland & Labrador:**

- Air Canada: Daily seasonal service, non-stop from London Heathrow (May-Sept.).
